Unlike most women at the time, Sejal got an engineering degree and pursued a career in technology. She moved her family from their small town to Mumbai for bigger opportunities. Although it was not easy to leave her husband and daughter behind until they could join her,

Sejal knew she had to follow through on her dreams.

Today, Sejal helps her clients define the best solution when they need to completely reinvent their enterprise. Her engineering background makes her uniquely qualified to help her clients move to a clean digital core and composable architecture.

Sejal is also very enthusiastic about her role as part of the Executive Council in Accenture India's Inclusion and Diversity team. Aniyah Jean (AJ) Fernandez Rivera, Senior Business & Integration Architect, started at Accenture 25 years ago as a software analyst. Within a few years, she was managing large projects for companies like Marriott International, AMEX, and Bank of America.

"When I started my career more than two decades ago, the corporate world was in a different place. It was not ready for trans women in the workplace," AJ recalls. "It was easier to have a professional career by hiding that part of me. So, I lived a double life and

pretended to be an effeminate queer boy at work."

In 2019, AJ felt it was the right time to declare her authentic female self. With the support of her boss, AJ informed her clients and colleagues about her gender identity. While this could have been terrifying, AJ said, "It felt like hope. I felt more creative, more productive, more energized. I could just breathe freely."

Today, AJ is a managing director and Technology Products Lead for Accenture in Canada — as well as Technology Inclusion and Diversity Lead for Canada — an outspoken trans woman in technology and a leading LGBTQ+ advocate and mentor at Accenture.
